

Homemade Hot Chocolate

Ingredients:

- ★ 4 cups milk
- ★ 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- ★ 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cups bittersweet or semisweet chocolate chips or chopped chocolate bar
- ★ 1/4 tsp pure vanilla extract

Instructions:

Place milk, cocoa powder and sugar in a small sauce pan. Heat over medium-low heat, whisking frequently, until warm (but not boiling). Add chocolate chips and whisk constantly until the chocolate chips melt and distribute evenly into the milk. Whisk in vanilla extract and serve immediately with your favorite toppings!
