Homemade Slush

Going to the movies might be on hold for now the summer, but you can make this classic frozen treat at home with just a few house hold items. Here's everything you need:

Supplies:

- 2 cups of water ½ cup of sugar
- Your blender Cups and straws for serving
- 1 drink mix packet (choose cherry or blue raspberry to make it taste like the kind you get at the movies)

Instructions:

- 1. Have your kids add each ingredient into the blender (with adult supervision, of course).

The RM of Montcalm would like to remind everyone who has Household domestic animals to remember the following:

- Dogs should be leashed at all times when outdoors;
- Pick up after your animal to help keep our communities clean &
- Continually barking/meowing can be disruptive to your neighbors;
- No owner or person in charge of animal shall allow it to run at large;
- All dogs over 4 months of age are to be licensed (available at RM Office):
 - All household animals should have their vaccinations up to date at all times;
- No person shall own, harbor, keep or have on their premises more than 3 dogs or 5 cats at any time (over the age of 4 months)
